Through sustainable innovation, we aim to increasingly deliver lighting products, systems, and services which have measurable environmental and social benefits. We identify positive impacts in sustainable focal areas: energy, circularity, weight & materials, packaging, substances, human centric lighting, basic needs, and access to light.

Sustainable operations means driving the environmental and social performance of our operations and supply chain.

Environment: We are committed to protect the environment, focusing on prevention and practices that minimize the impact of our operations. Our environmental performance focusses on reducing energy use, increasing renewable electricity use, reducing our carbon footprint (in manufacturing, non-industrial sites, logistics and business travel), and reducing waste.

Safety: We are committed to a safe and healthy workplace for our own operations, for our contractors, and in turnkey projects. We strive for a zero injury workplace by living the injury prevention competences of early recognition and elimination of injury and/or illness hazards.
